- *Kirby discussed an event at Westrac TOMAGO next year. They are celebrating 20 years of operation on that site and our club will be invited to that event with vehicles for display. Date is yet to be advised. Kirby will stay in touch with Westrac staff. It was also mentioned about putting our new show dates in Owner Driver and Big Rigs publications. NSW Historic Motoring Association Inc

Bulletin 2023/14 30 November 2023

To all NSW HMA Clubs - some good news!

On November 4th we conducted "Roadshow Dubbo" at which Matt Cafe,



Manager, Partnerships, from Transport for NSW (TfNSW), responded to some 15 pre-submitted questions on many aspects of the Historic and Classic Vehicle Schemes, as well as wide-ranging discussion on these and many other subjects raised by those present. Matt Cafe is chair of the Historic and Classic Industry Working Group (HCIWG) which is the main forum for us and other peak bodies to try and achieve outcomes on the many issues that affect the schemes. The meeting was a great success with over 80 delegates present representing more than 40 clubs. This format may be able to be repeated in other Roadshow locations in the coming year.

During this event, a number of important initiatives were revealed. It must be noted, however, that the information on the TfNSW website is not yet updated for any of these.

1.Seatbelts in pre-ADR vehicles: We were advised that following the many sets of period instructions sent in to TfNSW that had been provided by our members, TfNSW are now drafting new rules. Clubs will be advised as soon as these are published.

Some interesting facts emerged that most were not aware of.

- •An L or P plate driver may only operate a vehicle if everyone in the vehicle is in a seat with a seatbelt or an approved restraint fitted (except for medical exemption).
- •Children under 12 may not be passengers in a vehicle not fitted with seatbelts.
- **2.** Secondary Clubs: The Declaration forms 1259 and 1835 invite secondary clubs to be entered in addition to the primary club.
- •It was confirmed that this information is not recorded and has no application whatsoever.
- •It was further stated that club runs initiated by a secondary club must be entered into the logbook unless that run is an event also listed by the primary club.
- •The overarching message to resolve the confusion and abuse of club runs was to enter all runs in the logbook.
- •TfNSW is planning a new "Factsheet" expanding upon the rules for club runs and vehicle usage.
- **3.** Loads: The current rules state:
- •Loads cannot be carried for commercial purposes.
- •Loads must be the private property of the vehicle operator and/or carried as part of a club event.
- •Loads must be restrained to the standards detailed in the "Load Restraint Guide."
- •The new rule removes the second of the above statements leaving the sole criteria being the restriction on use for commercial purposes.

- **4.** Plates for the Classic Vehicle Scheme: These have had a 3-year gestation period, but we were assured they would be available by year's end. Stocks may take some months to reach all Service NSW offices. It has since been confirmed they are being manufactured.
- •The new plate format (if available) will be issued initially only to new registrations. It will be a new letter suffix (not D or E).
- •Change to the new plate format will be later permitted also at renewal, incurring the new plate fee.

"Wheels not turning": Resolved at an earlier date was a rule concerning logbooks and vehicles standing on streets. The "wheels not turning" rule clarifies confusion over the parking of historic vehicles on public roads. It is not necessary to record in the logbook days when a vehicle does not move. However, a logbook entry is required if the vehicle is moved on or onto a public road, even if only to reshuffle vehicles parked in a property.

At the AGM on 18 November, our Founding President Phil Mudie was again elected President. Phil intends to serve just one year in that position in which time he aims to establish succession plans and to "steady the ship" on our established course. Despite the acknowledged difficulties of the past year the Association has been able to continue with our normal activities, thanks largely to the continuing good work and support of the Committee most of whom have now been with us for several years. Our programme of recruiting new candidates for committee is proving successful with the first of our new trainees joining the Committee this year and three more in the wings for the future.

Please advise us which Club you are from - to ensure an Invitation has been sent and in turn be approved by your Club for you to attend. Editors Note:- In the absence of a Club Invitation those attending from other clubs must use the Log Book System.

Before involved Clubs close for the Christmas period

Also ensure that you are a Financial member

All Tractors participating will need to do a minimum speed of 22 kph, and be fitted with a side mirror

There is a concrete loading ramp available – at 900 high

Camping fees: \$5 per person / per night with no power / Power is very limited – if needed, please talk to Mary or Jeff

IF YOU DO NEED POWER, you will need to bring your own long power leads & power boards

Other information:

There is a kitchen, with a BBQ and fridges

Power is available in the kitchen for your portable fridges and to charge phones

If you have any special dietary requirements, please self-cater

Please note once trekking, toilet facilities are few and far between

Please bring: Shared items for morning tea – Saturday and Sunday

Thermos (if you have one). Chair and your own cutlery, crockery, coffee mug.

Breakfast - plus your cooking equipment, if other than a BBQ needed.

Friday: Tea (dinner) – bring your own meat for the BBQ and a shared salad or dessert

Saturday: Safety brief to be held at 6.15 am sharp – everyone to attend

Depart out the front gate at 6.30 am, as we have 130 kms to cover

Heading north along The Clarence Way, stopping for morning tea along the way. Then turning left onto Carnham Road to cross the Clarence River at Coombadjha

We are stopping at the Mann River for lunch. This will be a selection of cold meat and salad items to make into a sandwich or have on a plate. Lunch is \$5 per head and includes your tea / coffee for the weekend

Once we cross the river, we are then travelling on the Cangai Road, we will be calling in quickly to see the River at Cangai, Then before we get to Jackadgery, we turn onto the Jackadgery Lilydale Road (toilets at Jackadgery – approx. 1 kms)

Crossing the Clarence River again at Lilydale (toilets at Lilydale), then a right turn back on the Clarence Way to base camp.

Tea is at the Rest Point Hotel at your own expense. This is a short walk with a hill, some cars will be available to shuttle people

Sunday: 8.30 am Safety Briefing

8.45 am departing out the front gate, turning right and heading through the township along The Clarence Way and turning right into Whiteman's Creek Road. Left onto Rogans Bridge Road, crossing the Clarence River, then turning right to travel on the Eatonville Road, to Eatonville for morning tea at the river.

Then the direct route back to the Rodeo Grounds, crossing the river again. Having travelled approx 45 kms.

Whilst everyone is loading up a Sausage sizzle will be cooked, to enjoy together before hitting the road for home.

Fundraising: As usual we will be fundraising for the Westpac Rescue Helicopter – if you wish to donate, it is \$5.00 per Historic vehicle.

NOTICE TO ALL MEMBERS OF WAUCHOPE YESTERYEAR TRUCK & MACHINERY CLUB Inc.

The use of any vehicle or machinery under the Heritage Vehicle Scheme with the Club, can only be used under the following conditions;

To an event that is printed in the newsletter. This must be recorded in the movements book with the Club Registrar/s. A copy of the Newsletter must also be carried.

To take your heritage registered machine/vehicle within 5kms for a service run or to have it inspected for registration.

Alternatively, use the 60 Day Logbook to attend other events.

For picking up of projects (not for hire or reward).

Always carry you current membership card and 60 Day Logbook.

When travelling on a Club Organised Run the Newsletter of the event only covers members from Point A (the starting point of the run) and Point B (the completion of the run). From home to Point A and Point B to Home is not covered by the Newsletter. This is where the 60 Day Logbook must be used. Also the shortest route must be adhered to and no diversions to carry out extra curricular activities, eg, shopping, visiting relatives, etc.




