**Logbook 60-day scheme**: Members that are on the 60-day Logbook Scheme must fill in the booklet for each day's use if it is not listed in Club Events.

Logbook must be filled out for maintenance (test runs), rego checks & personal use and carried with you. (If not on logbook scheme you must contact the Secretary for maintenance runs and personal use). See back page for more information

Question from Wayne Magann re vehicles that don't have seat belts fitted being detected by mobile camera:

The following information is on Transport for NSW website:

What if my vehicle doesn't have seatbelts installed or has a lap-belt only?

All light vehicles have been required to have seatbelts fitted since 1965. Where a seatbelt is available, it must be used. Where the cameras have detected a seatbelt offence, Transport will endeavour to determine if the vehicle does not have seatbelts installed but is compliant with the Australian Design Rules at the time of manufacture.

A fine will only be issued if it is clear that a seatbelt offence has been committed, including evidence that a lap-only belt is not worn or worn incorrectly. If you receive a penalty notice but believe you haven't committed an offence, you can request a review by Revenue NSW. Where possible, passengers who are in a vehicle that does not have seatbelts fitted should sit in the back seat.



# Transport for NSW DRIVE Lite Historic and Classic Vehicles

**July 2024** 

Welcome to the July 2024 edition of Drive Lite Historic Vehicle Scheme (HVS) and Classic Vehicle Scheme (CVS).

As requested, this edition will highlight the new NSW seatbelt detection camera program and what this means for historic and classic vehicle drivers.

We are also pleased to announce that a new number plate is available for the Classic Vehicle Scheme.

#### What seatbelt detection cameras mean for your vehicle

Seatbelts are recommended for all vehicles where installation is possible. If a seatbelt is available, it must be used. Wearing a seatbelt doubles the chance of surviving a crash and reduces the risk of injury. Each year, around 29 people are killed and 76 are seriously injured on NSW roads because they were not wearing an available seatbelt.

Passengers who are in a vehicle that does not have seatbelts fitted should sit in the back seat, where possible.

Seatbelt detection cameras detect vehicles where a seatbelt is not worn properly by both drivers and passengers. As with police detection, the driver can be fined and have demerits applied if they and/or their passengers are not wearing their seatbelt properly.

The age of the vehicle and the requirement of the vehicle to have seatbelts fitted will be considered by trained officers in determining whether to issue a fine.

It is important to make sure your vehicle is compliant and has the appropriate registration. A vehicle that does not have seatbelts installed must be compliant with the relevant legislation and/or Australian Design Rules at the time of manufacture.

Registering a classic or historic vehicle does not mean that you are automatically exempt from seatbelt compliance. Existing child car seat and seatbelt road rules continue to apply.

Seatbelt detection operates in a similar way to mobile phone detection. Cameras will capture images of passing vehicles in all traffic and weather conditions. Artificial intelligence software then automatically reviews images and detects potential offences.

The images showing likely offences go through several stages of human review before a fine is issued. NSW Police will also continue to enforce seatbelt and restraint compliance.

If you receive a fine but believe you haven't committed an offence, you can request a review by Revenue NSW. More information about requesting a review is available on the Revenue NSW website.

#### New number plates available for classic vehicles

Thanks to industry feedback, collaboration, consultation and testing, a new number plate for classic vehicles is now available. The plate size and design better fits most classic vehicles and enhances authenticity by differentiating classic vehicles from others on the road.

The new number plate replaces the Conditional number plate traditionally issued to vehicles in the scheme. It will be automatically issued to new Classic Vehicle

Scheme registrations and available to be purchased for a one-off fee of \$55 for existing vehicles in the scheme at the time of registration renewal.

About the new plates, Terry Thompson OAM President of the Council of Motor Clubs said, "The new plates are a demonstration of the collaborative relationship between industry and Transport for NSW." "They represent a customer centric solution to our needs and help to differentiate classic vehicles from other conditionally registered vehicles," said Terry.

#### Friday 19th July - Day One TDAMC Bike Rally





- ➤ Rego checks for HVS (Historic Vehicle Scheme) cars to be done with Stuart, Brent or Dion Larkham at Engines 4U, 117 Marius St, Tamworth Phone 67613636 for booking.
- > Cars new to the club are to be inspected for HVS eligibility by David Smith ph 0411351418.
- ➤ Rego checks for HVS motorcycles to be done by Peter Walton ph 0414669434, or Wayne Walton ph 0421110634, or at Engines 4U ph 67613636 for booking.

#### Requirements for vehicles/motorcycles on HVS (Historic Vehicle Scheme):

> They MUST be as CLOSE TO ORIGINAL CONDITION as possible, with NO ALTERATIONS except for safety features and must be OVER 30 YEARS OLD.

**USE OF LOGBOOK:** (a new Logbook will only be issued by RMS when your registration is due)

- Logbooks allow up to 60 days use per registration year. They are to be used for maintenance, Rego checks and personal use when out on a public road if it is not listed in TDAMC events.
- The driver's **FULL NAME** and the date must be entered in the Logbook at the start of each day's use. Only one entry per day is required, regardless of how many different drivers or trips taken that day.
- Entries in the Logbook must be in blue or black ink and must be carried in the vehicle when in use.
- ➤ Logbooks must be made available on request by a NSW Police Officer or an Authorised Officer and may be subject to audit.
- ➤ If the allocated 60 days Logbook use is exhausted, the vehicle can ONLY be used for club related events.

**IF NOT ON THE LOGBOOK SCHEME** maintenance runs need to go in the Day Book held by the secretary, also if attending rallies that are not listed in the magazine a Permit to Move Form is to be filled out.

**FOR CLUB EVENTS:** you need to carry a copy of the club's magazine or events page.

NOTE: TDAMC members with HVS registered vehicles/bikes <u>must attend at least 3 events per year</u>.

When out on the road on a TDAMC event make sure you abide by the road rules – the driver/rider is responsible if in breach of RMS road rules or in an accident that the driver/rider is at fault.
