

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SHARE A RECIPE

Slow Braised Lamb Shanks

INGREDIENTS

- Lamb shanks.
- Onions.
- Carrots.
- Celery.
- Fresh garlic cloves.
- · Fresh herbs.
- Tomato paste.
- Red wine.
- Stock.
 Salt and black pepper.



METHOD

- 1. **Sear the lamb:** Heat a large pot or Dutch Oven over medium-high heat. Pat the lamb dry with paper towels then drizzle with a little olive oil and season generously with salt. Add to the pot and sear until well-browned on all sides. Remove and set aside.
- 2. **Start the sauce:** In the same pot, sauté the onions, carrot, celery, garlic and herbs until soft and fragrant. Pour in the liquid (the wine and stock), stir well and bring to the boil. Add the lamb back to the sauce, then cover with a lid.
- 3. **Braise:** Place in a preheated oven. Allow to braise for 2-3 hours until the shanks are tender and the gravy has reduced. Serve with mashed potatoes, rice or polenta and spoon over the braising liquid.

Vale Paull Scully 8th November 1944 - 8th July, 2024



Paull was born at Auburn in late 1944, his family lived at Dee Why and moved to Harden at the end of WW2. He attended Murrumburrah Public School to 3rd year, when he was ready to go to High School his family moved to Kirrawee and he finished his schooling to 5th year at Jannali High School. When he left school he got a job in an Insurance Company in Sydney then he went to Sutherland Shire Council to become a Town Planner.

Paull was keen on race meetings in the old days Warwick Farm, Oran Park and Amaroo Park days. In 1963 he was involved in car rallies in his Mini mainly starting at Auburn using "Gregory's 100 mile around Sydney Road Directory."

Paull married Carol in 1970 and they had 4 children.

One of his main interests was Rally Cars, he started as a driver but he preferred to be a navigator.

In 1971 he moved to Port as a town planner on the local council. After about 15 years he became a self employed milkman, and knew all the customers by name till he retired when he needed a change. Paull then went into Real Estate at Bonny Hills for 10 years.

At this time he also had an Austin Healy Sprite which he sold to a museum in Japan, apparently it was only one of about ten in the world.

Paull was lucky enough to meet Dawn and they married in 2019 and just after in November came on a cruise on the Ruby Princess with the Car Club so 14 of us declared that went on their honeymoon with them.

Paull became a member of our Club in 2015; his first Club Car was a 1956 Vanguard Space Master then moved onto a 1970 MGB then a 1964 Humber Vogue Station Wagon.

Why have at least 10 manufacturers marketed cars named "Spider". Well, from the pictures above, it may be obvious that the term Spider is not a name at all, but rather a type of car i.e. an open top sports car. So, why the term Spider. Well, the terminology originated before cars were in use. The spider name dates back to the 1800s, when horse drawn carriages were

the main mode of transportation. These carriages, sometimes called "Phaetons", came in all sorts of shapes and sizes.

There were cargo carriages, people movers, and lightweight, less cumbersome carriages which, thanks to their looks, came to be known as "Spiders". As you can see from the picture, these carriages had a smaller body and large wooden wheels with thin spokes, which look a bit like spider's legs. Once cars were in general use, this name became used for lighter, more agile, sporty vehicles, often with no roof or a canvas top.

The Messerschmitt KR200



After the end of WWII, the Messercompany was prohibited schmitt aircraft from producing aeroplanes, so it needed to turn to other products. Its factories and resources lent themselves to automotive manufacture, so in 1952, work began on the design of a "small automobile". Their first vehicle to hit the market was the KR175 Kabinenroller (scooter with cabin). This replaced by the KR200 in model was 1955 with a retail price of just DM2,500. The car was an instant success with almost 12,000 being sold in the first year. The vehicle had a 191cc, single cylinder two stroke engine, which could operate in both crankshaft rotational directions. The 4 speed, seunsynchronised quential. transmission worked in both forward and reverse. The car had a top speed of 90kph.





In order to prove the KR200's durability, Messerschmitt prepared a special vehicle to break the speed record for three-wheeled vehicles under 250 cc. The car had a single-seat low-drag body and a highly modified engine, but the suspension, steering, and braking components were standard. The car was run in August 1955 for 24 hours and broke 22 international speed records in its class, including the 24-hour speed record, which it set at 103 km/h.

The KR200 was discontinued in 1964, with a total of 30,286 vehicles being sold world wide. Various body styles were produced, including a Roadster, a Kabrio Limousine and a Sport.
