



Fire fighting down the years


Our photo also shows the 1923 Garford engine used at Sawtell since 1950 for 10 years and the outgoing engine at the right. Sawtell Fire Brigade this week took possession of a new fire fighting unit, see story:

The 13 men in the well-organised team were absolutely ecstatic over the addition to their equipment of a \$35,000 fire engine. The engine, which arrived "bare" on Tuesday morning, was fully equipped and ready for operation on Tuesday evening.

North Coast zone inspector for NSW Fire Brigades, Mr. Rod MacDonald, proudly presented Sawtell Fire Captain, Mr. Noel Hamey, with the keys to the new machine at 11 am on Tuesday.

The new engine had arrived in a "bare" state, with virtually no equipment on board, but the situation was soon rectified with the transfer of equipment from the old Bedford fire engine to the new one.

Mr. MacDonald said the new engine had a 1,818 litre capacity water tank built into its structure, equipped with the pre-primed pump, and was also fitted with a 10.66m extension ladder for rescue work and fire fighting for two and three storey buildings.



Creepy Crawly Rally

The Queensland Veteran Car Club organised a Creepy Crawly Rally designed for the more feeble cars in the veteran car community. As other commitments had meant we were unable to attend the Pre-05 Rally in South Australia, we decided to take the 1904 Minervette back to its previous home state of Queensland. Fellow club members Glenn and Jenny also joined in the fun with their 1910 Brush. After figuring out where we were going (Laidley? Where's that? Turns out it is between and south of Ipswich and Toowoomba), we packed up the car and the tent and headed north.

Turning up at the Laidley Showground, we were greeted by many lovely veteran cars and their entourages – custom built transport and housing, highly attentive caretakers and impressive period costumes. Pizzas, a local entertainer and fine weather after a storm made for a lovely evening catching up with fellow mad folk slow veteran enthusiasts.

The first driving day of the rally dawned early and bright. The Minervette was rolled out of the trailer and was cranked into life. The gear problem that has been plaguing the car since we had it was still there, so once again

we had to be pushed to get going in top gear (there are only 2...) and off we chuffed, wheeling around corners and managing to time it through the intersections so as not to stop the car. On heading south, we encountered a bit of the hill. The Minervette slowed, and slowed, Alison jumped out of the car to see if weight reduction would help (it didn't) and Andrew tried valiantly to get the car back into first gear but it was having none of it and stalled. It's a light little car so we decided to push it to the top of the hill and hope that there was a decent downhill so we could jump start it on the other side. Even with a slight downhill and additional help pushing, we were unable to get it going again and so it was onto the breakdown trailer and back to the showground and into old car jail for the Minervette



We jumped in the modern and headed to the lunch stop and got to see the other rally cars arriving. And there were some really lovely and interesting cars.

After lunch, Andrew jumped into the Brush with Glenn and Jenny came modern with Alison as we headed on a scenic drive back to Laidley. Well, we thought we were going to Laidley. Following the Brush in the modern, we saw it turn south, which wasn't where we though it should be going. But we dutifully followed in case of any problems. Andrew was navigating and finally realised he was following the directions for the next day's run as he had assumed the booklet was on the right page... so a u-turn and back on track to end an eventful day of motoring.

The next day dawned bright and clear and, after deciding that the Minervette needed more attention that we could give it in a paddock, we trailered it into central Laidley for a display next to the historic Das Neumann Haus. A wonderful display of around 20 early cars much enjoyed by the locals.

After a lovely cream tea with the mayor, we were flagged off for a run to the lunch stop in nearby Forest Hill. Alison got a ride in the Brush this time and loved it. Sitting outside a café, a member of the public handed in a brass fitting they had seen falling off another old car. Glenn recognised that it was an oil cap, probably from another Brush. Thinking that our fellow participant would be OK without it and not being entirely sure whose car it had come from, we wrapped this oily item in some napkins to return it later in the day. Andrew hopped in with Glenn, with Jenny and Alison following modern for the rally route. Just as well, as on leaving Forest Hill, Andrew called to say the lost part was needed as the owner and his wife were covered in oil. She was not happy with this turn of events, particularly as it turned out the driver had forgotten to put the cap back on!

The events of the day were not quite over though. In our comings and goings from the showground, Andrew had spotted an old car at the back of a carport that he wanted to investigate. So, ignoring the storm clouds in the distance, we set off for a gentle stroll to look for this car. As we walked, the hill in front of us disappeared in the

rain and after a bit of discussion, we decided to turn back. The wind started to blow and then we heard a noise. We turned to see the rain advancing up the road towards us sounding like a freight train. We started to run but weren't fast enough to beat the storm. Sheltering against a shed, we moved from the front to the side to the back as the wind shifted until, already wringing wet and with the wind dropped, we walked the last couple of hundred metres to the showground. There we discovered our tent, pitched next to the stables, was under a waterfall and our fellow rally participants, nicely set up with their caravans, had lost their awnings. Amazingly it was dry inside our tent, so no emergency accommodation needed for the night.

We headed home via Allora as we needed to visit a wooden wheel specialist – you get to go to all sorts of places that you'd never otherwise know about with this hobby.
